LEGAL\_AWARENESS FROM 2020 11 EMAIL DATED 18 02 2021 TO HON'BLE CJI REGARDING APPOINTMENT OF CHIEF SECRETARY WHO IS A BENEFICIARY OF DISCRETIONARY QUOTA

Subject-Appointment of Chief Secretary who is a beneficiary of Discretionary Quota (DQ) of Government of Odisha in violation of Hon'ble Supreme Court guidelines on DQ and also violation of AIS rule and separation of power enshrined in the Constitution

## **Respected Sir**

With due respect I want to bring to your kind notice that I had already brought the above mentioned matter to the notice of Hon'ble President of India, Governor of Odisha, Prime Minister of India and Chief Minister of Odisha through email dated 27 12 2020 (copy attached).

I had earlier brought the matter of appointment of DGP in Odisha as well as other constitutional and statutory posts in Odisha which were violating the above mentioned criteria to the Hon'ble Chief Justice of India Shri Ranjan Gogoi through registered letter RO872311358IN dated 01 08 2019. In response to that letter I received a letter from Ministry of Personnel and PG North Block New Delhi addressed to the Chief Secretary Government of Odisha for taking appropriate steps within time limit of 60 days.

It is pertinent to mention that till date I have not received any communication in the above matter from the Chief Secretary of Odisha.

Again the Government of Odisha is doing the same mistake of appointing Chief Secretary who has violated Hon'ble Supreme Court guidelines by availing plot under DQ from HUD Minister Odisha by requesting in official capacity in official letterhead which shows loyalty and political affiliation and there is chance of quid pro quo.

Under the circumstances I request your good office to take suo motu cognizance of the issue and take appropriate action and give appropriate direction to both centre and state regarding the appointment of Chief Secretary and others.

I also request to quash the appointment of present Chief Secretary and appoint a new cadre officer who has no political affiliation in the interest of common citizen of the state because the cadre officers should not act as agents of political parties and should not work on behest of any political party.

In the case of Odisha the appointment of Chief Secretary has vehemently flouted the guidelines of Hon'ble Supreme Court by availing plot under Discretionary Quota from the HUD Minister of Odisha.
